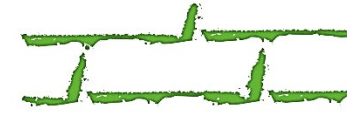

THE 2026 PROJECT

THE LOCATION: Chamelecón San Pedro, Honduras

Finish The Work is excited to announce that Providence Church's 2026 mission project will be to assist with the completion of Pastor Manuel Madrid's church, Manantial de Vida (Spring of Life) in Chamelecón, San Pedro, Honduras.

The church has a vibrant community of 350 adults and 220 children who regularly attend services.

THE WORK:

The team will be running electrical wiring throughout the church, installing windows and doors, laying tiles, painting, and various other tasks.

The trip is open to men, women, and teenagers (age 15+ with a parent or guardian). There will be a dedicated project leader to assist all team members with the needed tasks and instructions, as necessary.

THE COST:

The per person cost of the trip is \$1800 which is all-inclusive airfare to and from Honduras, housing, transportation in-country, and all meals. **Finish the Work** arranges all the flights for our team participants. And as this is a volunteer trip, all monies paid are 100% tax deductible. Donations from non-trip-goers are welcome. Scholarships may be available.

WHO IS "FINISH THE WORK"

The **Finish the Work** organization honors God by completing unfinished construction projects, serving communities in need, and giving individuals the opportunity to participate in this important work.

All over the world, well-intentioned mission groups begin construction projects to help churches and communities in need. But often, the group's time or funding runs out before construction is complete. This leaves the local church and community with a partially constructed building that it has no way to be completed without outside help.

Finish the Work specifically takes on projects that are already in some phase of construction, and they intentionally specify those that are within a scope they can complete within a reasonable time. Their efforts remain focused in Central and South America and the Caribbean so that they can maximize the use of local materials and construction practices. They have finished construction projects in countries including Belize, Trinidad and Tobago, Honduras, Nicaragua, Costa Rica and Barbados.

An essential part of the mission is to empower the local community, that is why they source materials in-country and hire local laborers to work alongside their volunteers. They think ahead about how the local church and community will fare after they leave. **Finish the Work** always provides a project coordinator who works closely with the local partnering organization, educating the pastor or community leader with relevant construction and maintenance information so they are equipped to maintain the building long after the mission teams have gone.
