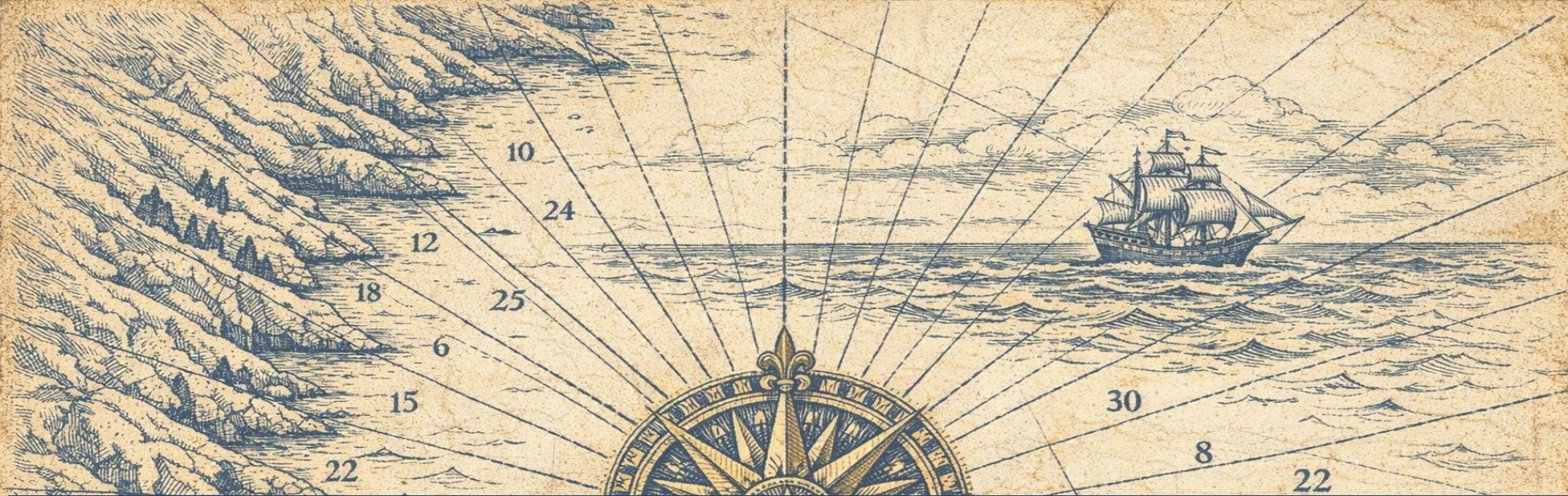


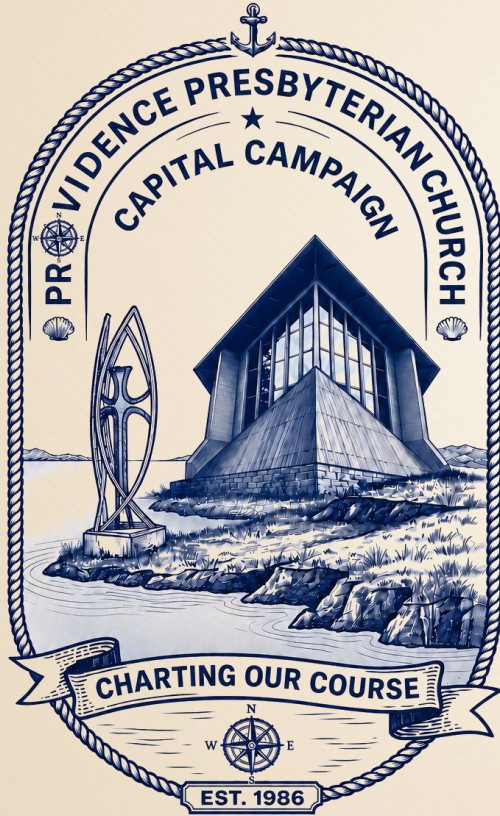

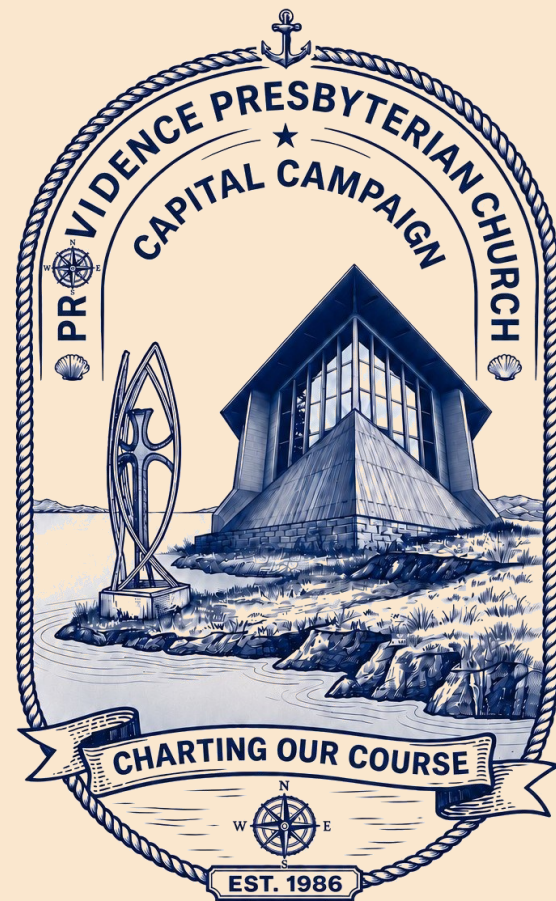

CAPTAIN'S LOG

Dear Providence Family,

***"In their hearts humans plan their course, but the LORD establishes their steps."* — Proverbs 16:9**

This verse has served as the anchor for our Steering Committee throughout the planning process for **Charting Our Course**. While we have prayerfully developed plans for Providence's future, we recognize that every step ultimately belongs to the Lord. Our desire has never been simply to build buildings, but to faithfully follow where God is leading His church.

Over the past several years, Providence has experienced remarkable blessings. We have witnessed growth in worship, discipleship, missions, outreach, and our ability to connect with our community. Through the faithful generosity of our congregation, we have completed significant improvements to our campus, including the Chapel in the Woods, the Administration Building renovation, the Mills Center renovation, and the Columbarium expansion, utilizing more than \$1 million in previously raised funds.

We have also recognized that ministry in the 21st century requires us to communicate and connect in new ways. Over the past several years, Providence has made significant technology upgrades, including campus-wide Wi-Fi, improved sound systems, new monitors and displays, and enhancements to our livestream and digital capabilities. These investments have strengthened our ability to worship, communicate, teach, and reach people both on our campus and beyond it. As we looked toward the future, it became clear that we needed more than individual projects—we needed a comprehensive plan.

Beginning in **March 2023**, we began developing a Master Plan for our campus. Rather than asking, *"What would we like to build?"* we began with a different question: **"What does Providence need in order to fulfill the mission God has given us over the next forty years?"** That process has been guided by three refreshed Strategic Goals adopted by our Session (see page 6). These goals have helped us look beyond our current circumstances and prayerfully consider what Providence will need to be a vibrant, faithful, and growing congregation for generations to come.

The projects presented in this booklet are the result of that prayerful process. They are **needs-based, not wish-based**. Each has been evaluated through the lens of ministry, stewardship, hospitality, accessibility, discipleship, outreach, and future growth. The goal is not simply to improve our facilities, but to create environments that help us fulfill our calling to **Cause God Joy**.

As we celebrate Providence's 40th Anniversary, we have the unique privilege of standing between generations. Others came before us with faith, vision, sacrifice, and generosity. 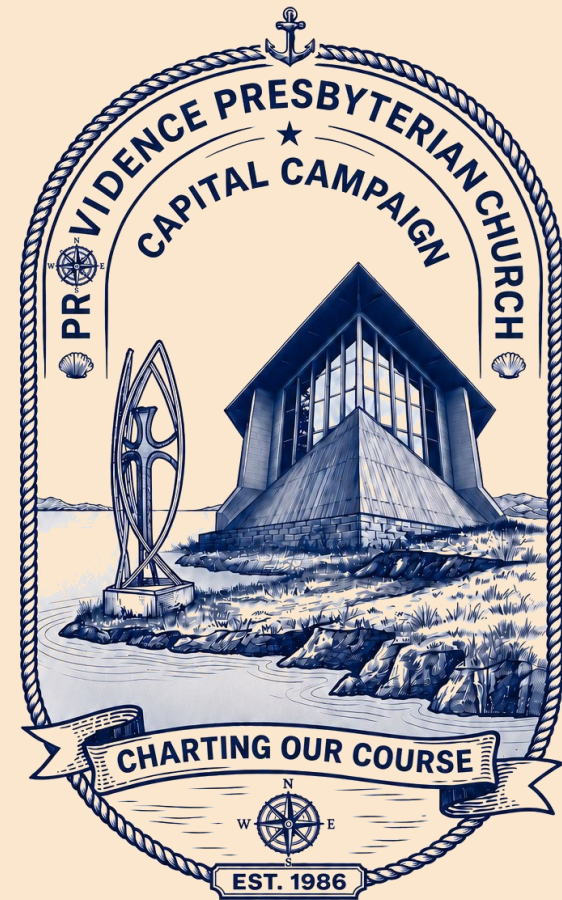

Every phase of *Charting our Course* was shaped with our Strategic Goals in mind.

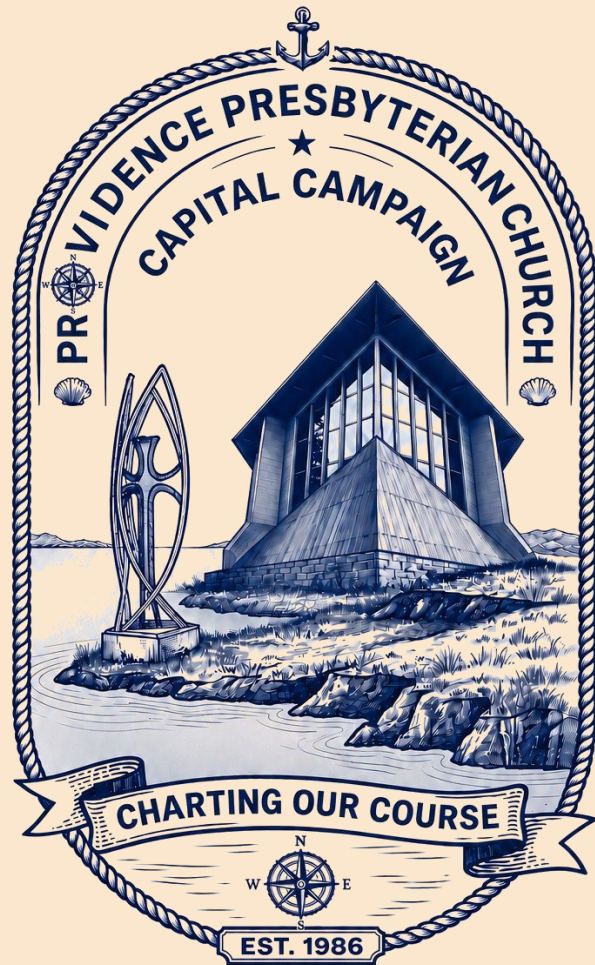

Three Phases and Timeline

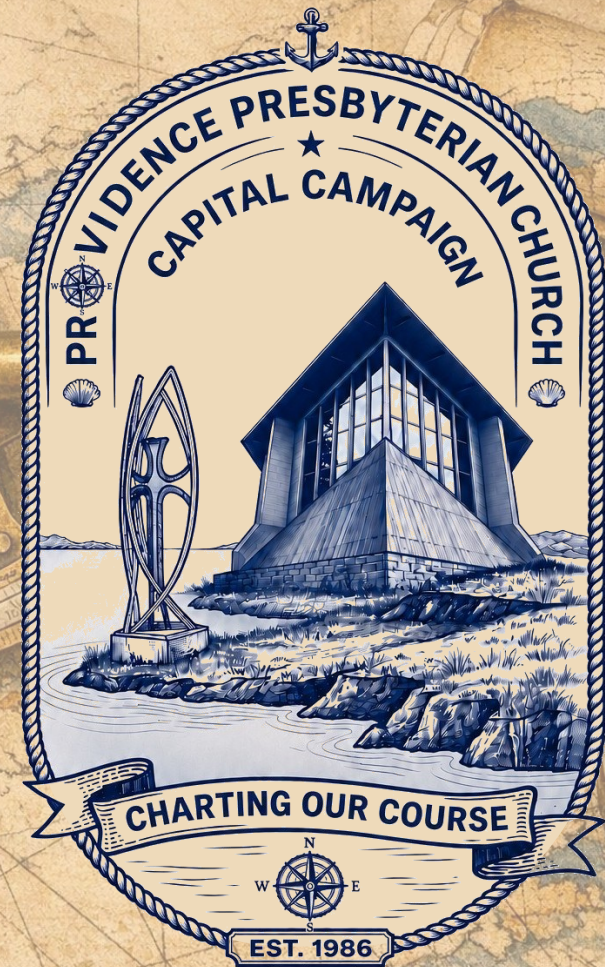

PHASE 1 - The Portico (Arrivals and Departures) – A Safe Anchorage

OUR GOAL is that the new Portico will:

1. Provide a safe, dry and covered entry and exit for all, especially those with mobility challenges.
2. Complete the connection of the Sanctuary, Administration Building, Fellowship Hall, and Mills Education Center via a covered walkway.
3. Enhance the aesthetic entrance to our campus and Sanctuary by leveling and landscaping the front campus.

OUR VISION is that the new Portico will:

1. Embody the sacred rhythm of Christian life: we enter with thanksgiving and are sent out to Cause God Joy.
2. Welcome worshippers into God's presence with Providence hospitality, finding a place of warmth and belonging.
3. Equip and encourage worshippers to go forth "in a manner worthy of God," carrying Christ's love into the world.
4. Serve as a threshold of transformation, where strangers become friends, friends become disciples, and disciples are sent into joyful service for the sake of the gospel.

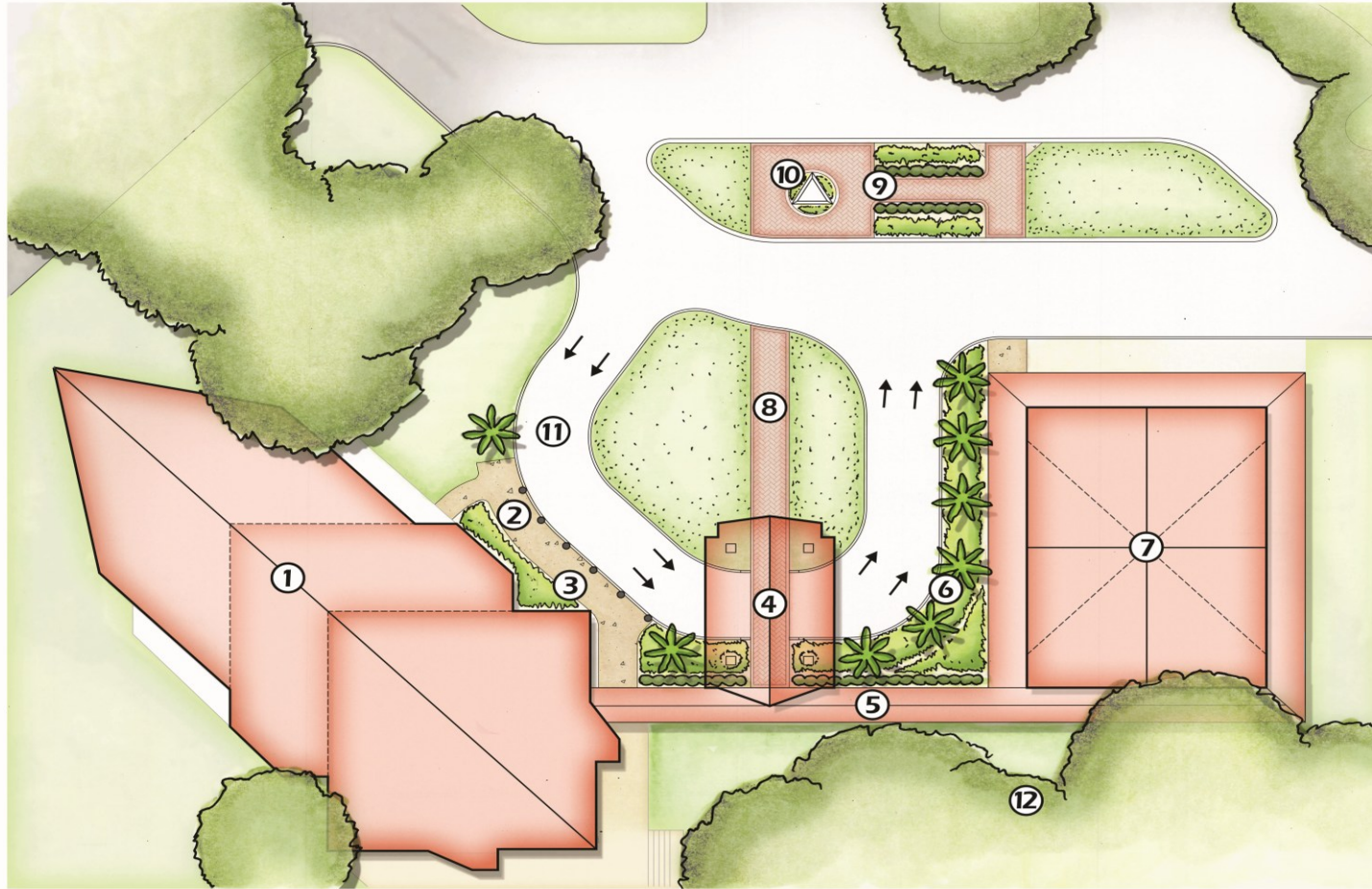

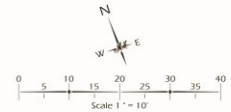

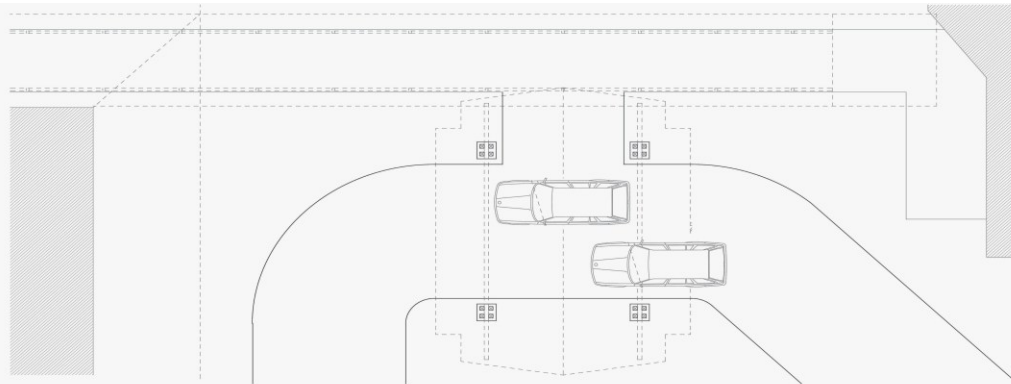

HILTON HEAD ISLAND, SOUTH CAROLINA

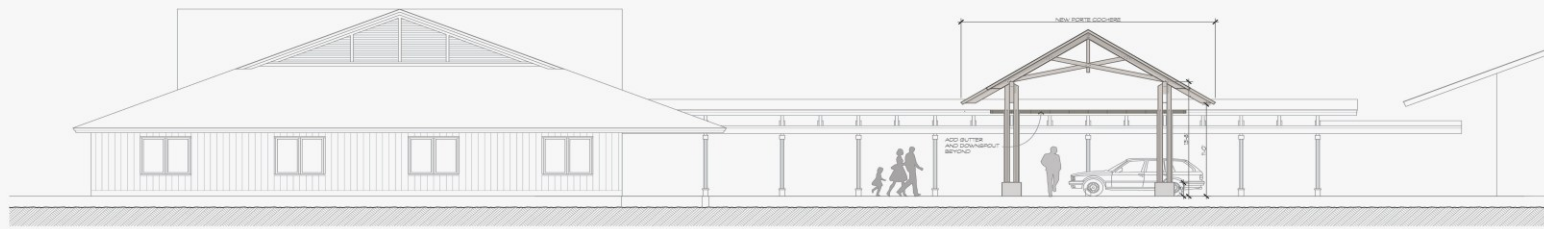

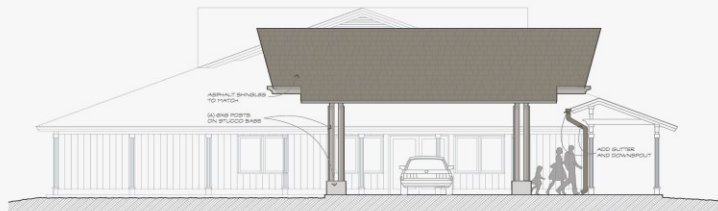
NEW PORTICO PLAN

PHASE 2 - Outdoor Sanctuary & Retreat Center – A Peaceful Harbor

The Outdoor Sanctuary & Retreat Center serve as both a place of worship and a place of rest.

OUR GOAL FOR THE OUTDOOR SANCTUARY:

1. Be an inviting place for worship, spiritual reflection, and community joy.
2. Honor God's creation and welcome others to experience the island's natural beauty.
3. Support our growing 8:30 am outdoor service by expanding the paved seating area.

OUR GOAL FOR THE RETREAT CENTER:

1. Serve as a refuge for mission groups, youth programs, adult seminars, and community gatherings.
2. Provide 48 beds for lodging plus 2 additional private rooms for adult leaders.
3. Renovate current catering kitchen into a fully functioning kitchen.
4. Upgrade bathrooms and storage facilities.

OUR VISION FOR THE OUTDOOR SANCTUARY AND RETREAT CENTER is to create:

- A gathering space for worship, reflection, and joy.
- A showcase of God's creation on Hilton Head Island.
- A quiet cove for mission, refuge, and renewal.
- A place to partner with our community.

BIBLICAL CONNECTION:

Mark 6:31-32 - *Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." So they went away by themselves in a boat to a solitary place.*



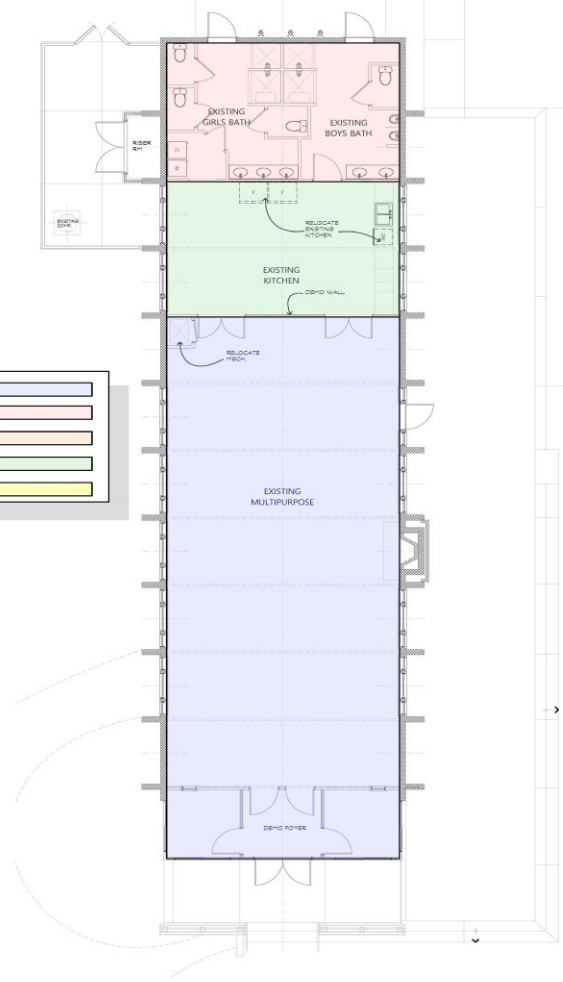

PHASE 3 - Fellowship Hall and Gathering Green (A Place to Gather) – *The Shoreline Feast*

OUR GOAL: The expanded Fellowship Hall and new Gathering Green will

1. Create a 67% expanded dining space to meet the growing needs of our Church community,
2. Increase capacity of the current Fellowship Hall by 50% (2000 square feet).

3. Provide a new commercial quality kitchen and enhance our ability to welcome all who gather.
4. Add and upgrade storage and restroom facilities.
5. Create a landscaped outdoor green designed to encourage community connection, church events, outdoor worship and recreational activities.
6. Link the Fellowship Hall, outdoor Gathering Green and Pavilion to create a massive “wharf” where the congregation can enjoy life together.

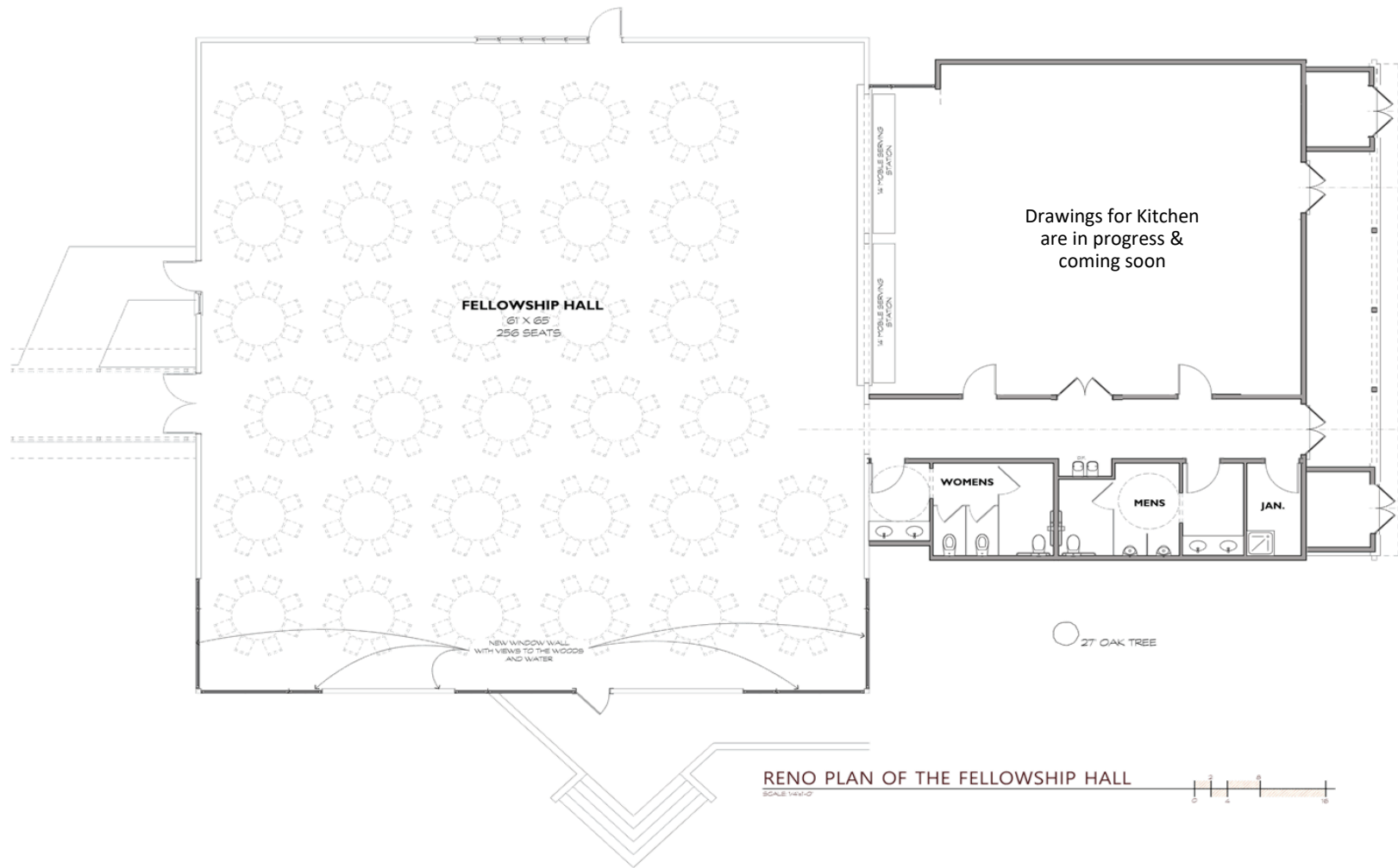

Our Gathering Green will become the campfire of the church. It is intentional space for intergenerational activities and connection for informal fellowship in the salt air.

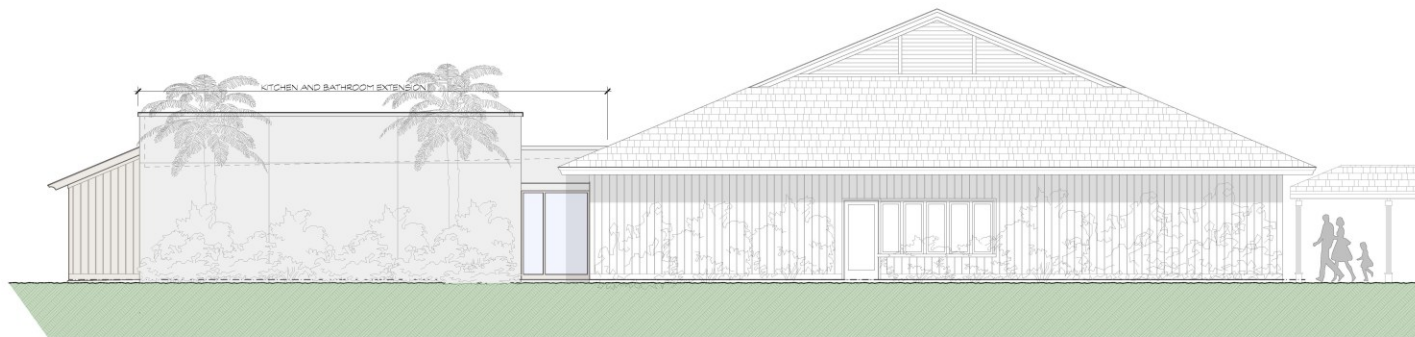






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PARKING LOT ELEVATION

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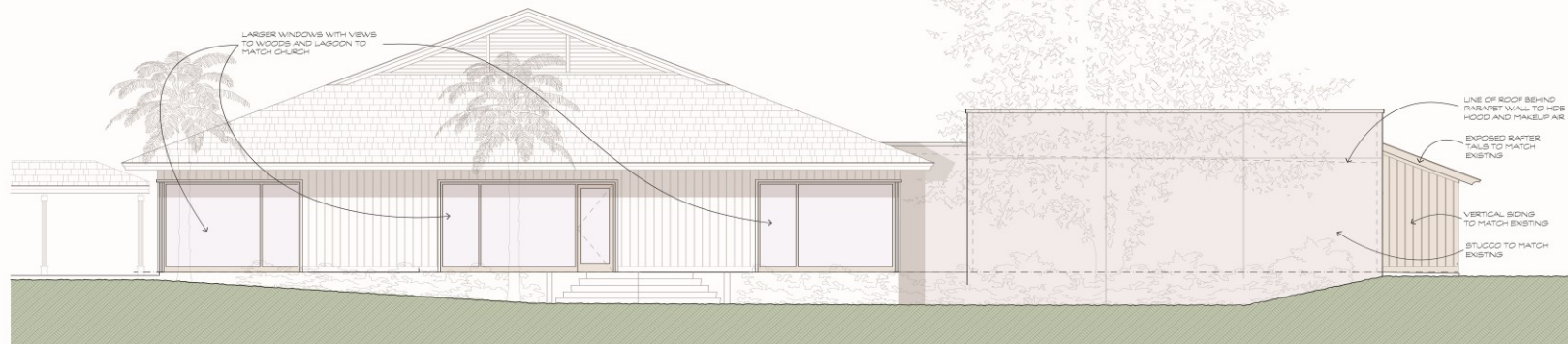
RIGHT SIDE ELEVATION

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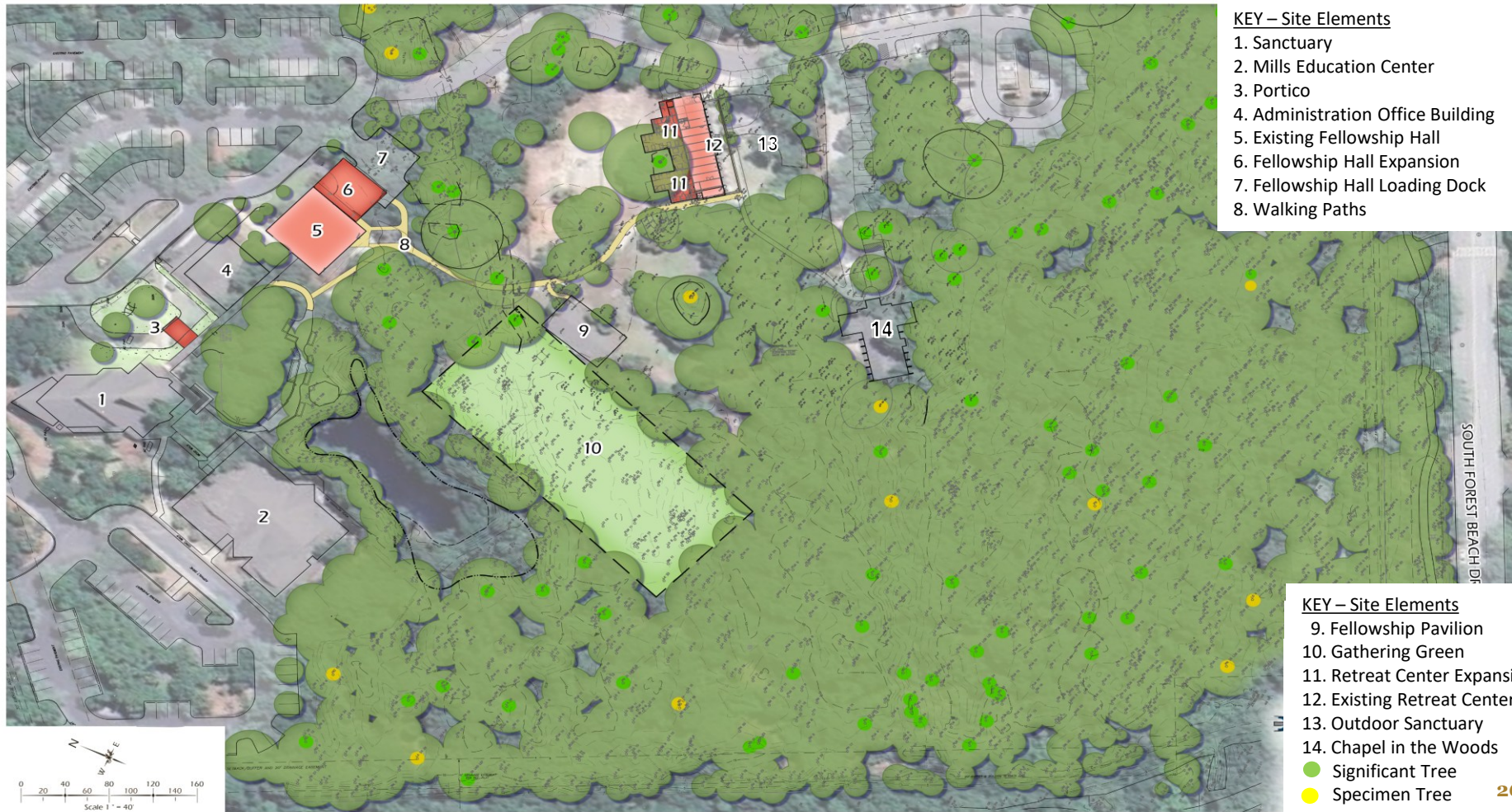

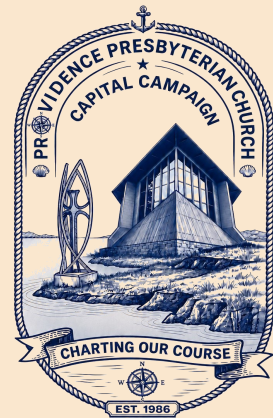

Frequently Asked Questions



Q1: What is the overall ministry goal of the Capital Campaign?

A: The campaign's ministry goal is to prepare Providence Presbyterian Church for future generations. The campaign will improve our campus in ways that strengthen worship, discipleship, fellowship, hospitality, outreach, and stewardship while preserving the character and mission of Providence. This is a ministry campaign supported by facility improvements—not simply a building campaign.

Q2: How was the Capital Campaign financial goal determined?

A: The financial goal reflects professional planning, conceptual design work, estimated construction costs, permitting, and anticipated project expenses for all three phases of the Master Plan. The goal represents the estimated investment required to complete the vision while allowing flexibility through phased implementation.

Q3: Why is Providence launching this campaign now?

A: This campaign is the result of several years of prayer, planning, and discernment—not a reaction to a single need. Providence is experiencing healthy ministry, growing participation, and increasing use of its facilities. The Master Plan began in 2023, and after careful study and planning, Session approved the plan in 2026. We believe this is the right time to prepare our campus to serve both current and future generations.

Q4: What projects are included, and why were they chosen?

A: The Master Plan includes three phases:

Phase 1: Portico

Phase 2: Outdoor Sanctuary & Retreat Center

Phase 3: Fellowship Hall & Gathering Green

These projects were selected after extensive planning because they address current ministry needs while preparing Providence for future growth. Each phase builds upon the previous one and expands our ability to serve members, visitors, and the community.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q5: Why are these projects needed now?

A: The Master Plan has been developed over several years of planning and prayer. Providence has strong ministries, growing participation, and increasing demands on its facilities. Rather than waiting until needs become urgent, the church is taking a proactive approach to prepare responsibly for future ministry.



Q6: Why is Providence focusing on future generations?

A: For forty years, Providence has benefited from the vision and generosity of those who came before us. We now have the opportunity—and responsibility—to prepare the church for our children, grandchildren, future members, and the community God will continue to bring to Providence.



Q7: Are we changing who Providence is?

A: No. This campaign is about strengthening Providence's ministry, not changing its identity. Our theology, mission, values, and commitment to God's Word remain unchanged. The Master Plan simply provides facilities that better support the ministry God has already entrusted to us.



Q8: How does this campaign strengthen Providence spiritually—not just physically?

A: Buildings are tools that support ministry. The campaign is designed to create spaces where people can worship, study God's Word, build relationships, serve others, and grow in their faith. Every project is intended to increase ministry opportunities, not simply improve facilities.



Q9: How does this campaign fit Providence's Mission, Vision, and long-term Strategic Plan?

A: The Master Plan supports the mission God has already given Providence. Every project was selected because it strengthens our ability to worship, learn, connect and serve others, and to Cause God Joy. Rather than changing who we are, this campaign provides the spaces and resources needed to carry out our mission more effectively in the years ahead.



Q10: Why are mission groups and youth lodging included in the vision?

A: Providence has a long history of missions and youth ministry. Providing lodging and gathering space expands opportunities to host mission teams, youth events, retreats, and leadership development while supporting ministries already taking place.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q11: Why is the campaign being completed in phases?

A: A phased approach allows Providence to complete projects in a financially responsible manner while maintaining flexibility as funding is received. It also minimizes disruption to ministry and allows each phase to build naturally upon the previous one.

Q12: How was the order of the project phases determined?

A: The phases were established after evaluating ministry priorities, campus functionality, project sequencing, and financial stewardship. Each phase builds on the previous one while allowing Providence to move forward responsibly as campaign goals are achieved.

Q13: Why is the Portico the first priority?

A: The Portico is the 'front door' to Providence. It improves first impressions, accessibility, safety, weather protection, and hospitality while creating a welcoming entrance for members and guests. It immediately enhances the experience of everyone who comes to the church.

Q14: Will recreational spaces or park amenities be included?

A: The Gathering Green is intended to be a flexible outdoor ministry space rather than a recreational park. Final features will continue to be refined as planning progresses, but the focus remains on fellowship, gatherings, hospitality, and ministry opportunities.

Q15: Will any trees or significant landscape features be affected?

A: The Master Plan seeks to enhance the beauty and functionality of the campus while respecting its natural setting. Any necessary changes to landscaping or trees will be carefully evaluated during final design, with an emphasis on preserving the welcoming character of Providence whenever possible.

Q16: Why are the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen being renovated again??

A: While previous improvements addressed existing needs at the time, ministry has continued to grow and evolve. The proposed renovations are intended to improve functionality, increase flexibility, better support larger ministries and events, and position these spaces to serve Providence well for decades to come.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q17: Why is the Retreat Center part of the plan, and how will it be used?

A: The Retreat Center is intended to support discipleship, leadership development, mission teams, youth ministries, church retreats, and other ministry activities. It will provide space for both overnight accommodations and ministry gatherings, allowing Providence to better serve members while expanding opportunities for outreach and spiritual growth.

Q18: What is the Gathering Green, and how is it different from the Outdoor Sanctuary?

A: The Gathering Green is designed as a flexible outdoor gathering space that encourages fellowship, community events, and informal interaction before and after church activities. The Outdoor Sanctuary is designed specifically as a worship venue for outdoor services and special events. Together, these spaces expand ministry opportunities while serving different purposes on campus.

Q19: How will the facilities be maintained, managed, and funded over the long term?

A: Long-term stewardship has been part of the planning process from the beginning. Providence has strengthened its maintenance planning and reserve funding over the past decade, and future operational plans will ensure these facilities remain sustainable and well maintained.

Q20: Will campaign giving affect Providence's annual ministry budget?

A: The Capital Campaign is separate from Providence's annual operating budget. Regular giving remains essential to supporting the church's ongoing ministries, missions, staff, and daily operations. Members will be encouraged to continue faithful annual giving while prayerfully considering an additional commitment to the Capital Campaign.

Q21: Will Providence incur debt?

A: The campaign has been designed around a phased approach that emphasizes responsible stewardship. Leadership's goal is to raise approximately 75% of the funding needed before beginning each phase, helping reduce financial risk while allowing projects to move forward responsibly.

Frequently Asked Questions



 **Q22: Are existing church funds, reserves, or the endowment being used?**

A: Church leadership continues to evaluate all available financial resources as part of responsible stewardship. Any use of reserves or other existing funds will be carefully considered and communicated to the congregation as decisions are made. The Capital Campaign remains the primary funding source for the Master Plan.

 **Q23: Can campaign gifts be spread over multiple years?**

A: Yes. Members will have the opportunity to make commitments that are fulfilled over the life of the campaign. Multi-year giving allows many more people to participate in a meaningful way while managing their personal financial commitments responsibly.

 **Q24: Can gifts be designated to specific projects?**

A: Campaign giving procedures will be communicated as the campaign progresses. Leadership's goal is to ensure gifts are managed responsibly while supporting the overall success of the Master Plan and the ministry priorities established by Session.

 **Q25: What happens if the campaign does not reach its financial goal?**

A: Because the Master Plan is phased, Providence can adjust project timing as needed. Leadership will evaluate funding levels, project priorities, and economic conditions before moving into each phase while remaining committed to responsible stewardship.

 **Q26: What happens if construction costs increase or the campaign falls short?**

A: The Master Plan was intentionally designed to be completed in phases. This allows Providence to move forward responsibly as funding becomes available while adjusting schedules if necessary. Leadership remains committed to careful stewardship and will make prudent decisions if economic conditions or project costs change.

 **Q27: Which contractor will be selected, and what experience do they have with church projects?**

A: Contractor selection will follow Providence's normal due diligence process. Experience, qualifications, cost, reputation, and the ability to work on an active church campus will all be important considerations before any final decisions are made.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q28: Who is making the final decisions, and how will transparency and accountability be maintained?

A: The Session has overall responsibility for the Capital Campaign and the Master Plan. The Capital Campaign Committee, church staff, consultants, architects, and ministry leaders all play important advisory roles. Throughout the campaign, Providence is committed to regular communication, financial transparency, and opportunities for members to stay informed and engaged as decisions are made.



Q29: How much disruption should members expect during construction?

A: Every effort will be made to minimize disruption to worship and ministry. Construction schedules will be planned carefully, and members will receive advance communication regarding any temporary changes to parking, entrances, worship locations, or ministry activities.



Q30: Will members still have opportunities to provide input as the projects move forward?

A: Yes. While the Master Plan establishes the overall direction, many operational details and design decisions will continue to be refined. Church leadership intends to provide updates and opportunities for input as individual projects move through planning, design, and construction.



Q31: When will construction begin, and how will it affect worship and church activities?

A: Construction will be phased to minimize disruption to worship and ministry whenever possible. As each phase approaches, detailed schedules and temporary arrangements will be shared well in advance so members know what to expect. Church leadership is committed to maintaining a safe, welcoming, and active ministry throughout construction.



Q32: How will Providence keep the congregation informed throughout the campaign?

A: Communication will be a priority throughout the campaign. 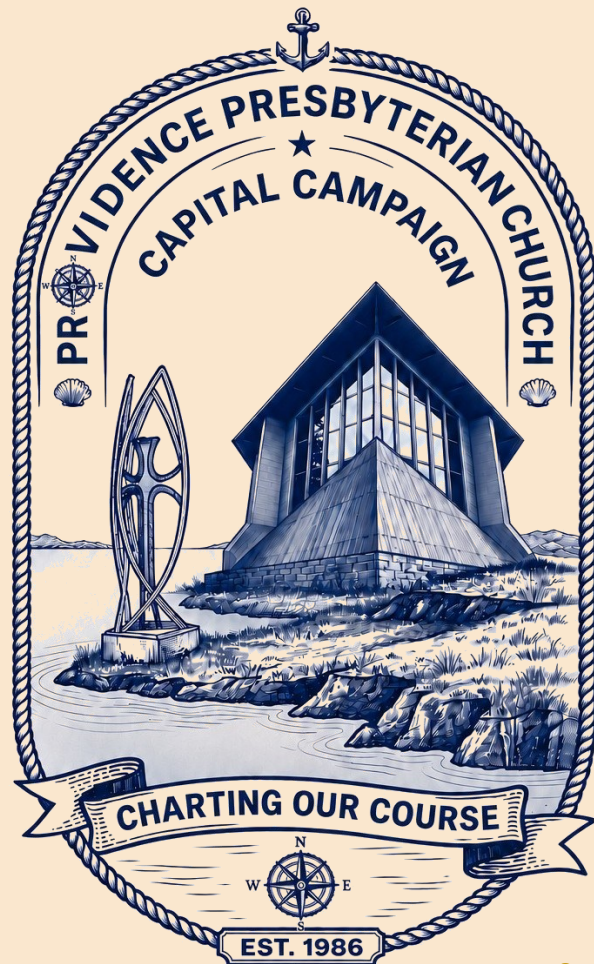
